GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE COMPANY'S ACTIVITIES AND IMPACT

BEEE Creative C.I.C. has continued to provide benefit to various community sub- groups across the age spectrum through the provision of arts activities. Through the delivery of arts activities, in partnership with a range of cross-sector organisations, schools and cultural venues, the organisation has reached 4,519 people as active participants or audience members (live) and approximately 53,000 online audience.

Activity summary:

- Completion of Museums in Motion 2.0: dance, technology and heritage project for young people in Hertfordshire Museums (Heritage Lottery Funded)
- Planning, development and delivery of Exhibit 2020: new arts, technology and heritage project for young people in 5 Hertfordshire Museums (The National Lottery Heritage Fund grant)
- Completion of Dance Re:Ignite: dance activity targeted at 50+ year olds incorporating a Festival, artist professional development, commissioned dance and performance tour (Arts Council England Funded plus district council support)
- Screening of Togetherness (dance animation film from Dance Re:Ignite 2017) at international animation festivals – 60 older adults from Hertfordshire are featured.
- Delivery of A-MUSE: family dance activities at Royston and Stevenage museums (The National Lottery Community Fund and North Herts District Council)
- Delivery of Improvising Generations: intergenerational music and dance workshops and residency projects (Building Connections Fund – The National Lottery Community Fund and Her Majesty's Government)

- Delivery of Creative Connections: dance for adults living with Parkinson's disease or other neurological conditions and their carers in Central Bedfordshire (National Lottery Community Fund grant)
- Research and development and project delivery through BEEE Valued (Arts Council England grant)
- Planning and delivery of **#TAG**: dance commissions to celebrate Hertfordshire Year of Culture 2020 (Arts Council England grant and district council support)
- One-off deliveries in a range of schools, Universities and for other arts organisations

We gather data from our participants and project partners to evaluate and better understand the impact of the arts activities on communities.

CONSULTATION WITH STAKEHOLDERS

Project funders: completed required funding application and reporting procedures according to individual funders guidelines.

Project partners: regular meetings with specific organisations to each project area to discuss planning, content delivery and feedback debrief. Project delivery teams also feedback during and after the projects.

Project participants: Feedback through baseline and follow up surveys, supported by focus groups and individual interviews. This is incorporated into project reporting to partners and funders and the planning of future projects. Through the BEEE Valued project we have run participant advisory groups sessions for the public to feedback on the development of BEEE Creative activity.
